PHYSICAL DEMAND ANALYSIS BEST PRACTICE

A subcommittee of the COAA Safety Committee, made up of a cross section of labour providers, employers and industry stakeholders, recently developed a Best Practice tool applicable to all members across the construction industry: more than 120 Physical Demand Analysis (PDA) documents that help support return to work and workforce allocation.

Why is it important to have PDAs?

Properly assigning the right activity to the right worker can help ensure the safe completion of a job. Having PDAs in place can help reduce return to work downtime by several days per occurrence. The average lost-time claim cost was \$87,500 (in 2014) and the incidence of a repeat injury is 35%. PDAs, as part of a safety program, help reduce these costs.

What is the cost?

FREE through the COAA Library! The initial costs to create PDAs for worksites have been a major hurdle for employers – averaging around \$1200+. This best practice through COAA was created to help reduce these start-up costs and make the tools more cost effective and accessible.
